Talks usually take place in a classroom, but we can deliver talks to larger groups on request. If we don't have a speaker in your area (or if you are outside the UK), we can arrange a remote talk via Zoom or Teams.

Our talks and resources are suitable for years 7 to 13 and align with the National Curriculum. We tailor each session to suit your students' needs, and all materials will be shared with you in advance for your approval.
